meager bust.






Monica

The president of the Student Council. One of Magical ★ Explorer's Big Three and a main heroine who features






Fran

Stef


Stefania Scaglione.

"Just that Evangelista probably isn't that great in combat, really. Sure, she's in the top of the class if you look at her test scores or whatever, but it feels like ranking based on exam results doesn't really tell you much. I've seen a whole lot of people who seem much more dangerous than her already."

"Yeah, studying and fighting are totally different. Our deepest dungeon level is also going to be taken into account on our next test, so I think things will start to look different then. Wait, but who are these other 'dangerous people' supposed to be?"

People who seemed dangerous to the girl with the Sense Danger skill? Now, that was intriguing.

"Well, there's Katou for one, and Ludivine, too. There's also the foxfolk student who takes naps on benches. Oh, and you're included in that group as well, Takioto. Heck, you're at the top of the pack if anything. And while I wouldn't say he'd give you a run for your money or anything...my big brother has surprised me in more ways than one."

I thought back to that moment. The things he said to me.

If I had to guess, Iori was powering up right this very moment.

People with a penchant for speedrunning *MX* almost always make use of a certain item in their endeavor—a chart that outlines their route through the game.

They would refine their route by coming up with ways to increase their efficiency while occasionally referencing the charts of others. Additionally, there's one more thing these speedrunners (myself included) would almost invariably do on their runs—obtain a specific skill.

"A ninja skill...?"

In Magical★Explorer, the ninja class gets special treatment.

There are a number of ways to obtain the ninja skill in question. You can either learn it from an instructor or student character well versed in ninjutsu, or you can obtain it in one of the dungeons. Normally, the former would be the quickest route for picking up skills in general.

However, considering that one of the skills I had to acquire at all costs could only be obtained in a dungeon, that I had some chores to take care of, and that I wanted to grab a couple of items in the most efficient manner possible, I thought it best to visit this dungeon instead.

I guess you could say it was practically fate that I ended up coming here.

Still, depending on how I advanced through the dungeon, begging the instructors or other characters to teach me may not have been too bad, either. Of course, that was only true if clearing the dungeon was taking up more time and effort than I wanted.

There was just one skill I couldn't do without. As long as I could get my hands

on it, I'd decide how to take care of my other tasks based on my progress. In any case, I didn't have to think about that at the moment.

It was hard to place, but the flooring had this unnatural feeling to it, a strange springiness that was akin to stepping on rubber. Plus, the mere fact that I was going across tatami in my outdoor shoes filled me with revulsion.

"It does feel weird, yeah."

As I watched Ludie, Nanami, and Yuika trample over the tatami, a thought suddenly came to me. Was tatami in the perfect position to satisfy one's fetishfilled mind? If I became one of these mats, then the girls could literally step all over me, even smother me with their butts when they sat down.

Uh-oh, now I was the one getting weird here.

As my chest swelled with not-insignificant envy toward the tatami, Nanami smoothly readied her bow. Almost simultaneously, Yukine put her hands on her naginata.

I immediately brandished my stole and placed my palm on my katana before signaling Ludie, a stern expression already coming over her, with a glance.

Keeping in line with the name and appearance of Karakuri Trick Castle, they were uniformly Japanese in design.

Adzukiarai and ittan-momen were low-level monsters that appeared in the early layers of every Japanese-style dungeon, this one included.

"Leave the flying ones to me," Ludie announced.

After entrusting the ittan-momen to her and Nanami, Yuika and I dashed forward to deal with the adzukiarai.

The annoying thing about adzukiarai was that they possessed long-ranged attacks. Noticing our approach, the creatures began to attack us, firing off magic masses that resembled their namesake—adzuki red beans.

Fortunately, the missiles weren't very fast, so I easily deflected them with my stole.

And I wasn't the only one parrying them.

"Hmm? Is something wrong?"

Yuika deflected the projectile beans with her gauntlet as she looked over at

me.

"This is no sweat for you, huh?" I shouted.

I'd gotten a look at Yuika's abilities in the previous dungeon. She did indeed possess a main heroine's strength, so she'd be able to improve by leaps and bounds if she kept training. However, she does have an unfortunate downside in the game: Her role in battle overlaps a bit with St. Doomsday, the Founding Saint.

Still, Yuika is cute in a sort of obnoxious way, her thighs and black knee socks are an exceptional combo, she refers to you as "big brother," and she doesn't overlap in any *other* areas, so saying that I loved her would be putting it mildly. There was no way I *wasn't* going to include her in my party in this world.

Besides, as long as you weren't trying to speedrun, it was fine having two healers to a party at once. She'd have no issues being in the same group as the Founding Saint... If anything, the two of them actually worked really well together. That was partially down to how alien the Founding Saint was, though.

"Oh, c'mon, Takioto, you're not having any trouble, either!" Yuika yelled back.

That may have been true, but I'd only risen to this level by dedicating myself to training alongside everyone else. I'd want to cry myself to sleep if I was still weak after all that.

Anyway, I was surprised that Yuika could move so deftly, given she hadn't collected many magic particles yet. This must've been what talent looked like. They don't call her the most gifted of the first-years in the game for nothing.

"All right, I'm going to send one flying this way. The rest is up to you."

Saying this, I dashed off, barreling forward as I reflected the adzuki missiles flying at me. There were two adzukiarai ahead of me. After I slammed my Fourth Hand down hard on one of their heads, I then grabbed the creature and pitched it back toward Yuika while drawing my katana.

After making sure the other adzukiarai was split clean in two, I turned to Yuika.

"Taaake this!"

A white light was radiating from her gauntlets, either with mana or some skill. She put the weight of her whole body behind her fist and slammed it into the adzukiarai I'd hurled toward her.

I had asked her to accompany us but steer clear of most of the fighting this time. It would be a good experience for Yuika. Naturally, Yukine had agreed to the request.

She finished collecting the magic stones and cotton cloth dropped by the cloth monster, ittan-momen, along with the magic stones from the adzukiarai, before muttering:

"Guess we keep going, then."

"Actually, could you wait a second, Yukine? How's it look, Nanami?"

I signaled the maid with a look.

"Indeed, my Nanami sensor's ringing loud and clear. It should be around here."

I had already planned out this exchange with her beforehand, so I punched

the wall hard right after she said that. But there was no reaction. It had to be around here, right? This time, I slammed the opposite side of the corridor.

Thinking maybe it was the section right next to it, I threw another punch into the paper wall. I was rewarded with a loud *ka-shunk*, like something fitting into place, and the wall slowly slid sideways.

A corridor had appeared before us. I would need to go through this hidden path to get my hands on my coveted ninja skill.

Nanami addressed Yuika as she stood in front of the door, dumbfounded.

Yuika looked entirely unconvinced, but she ultimately didn't say anything more and started down the hidden path.

When you bring up *Magical***Explorer's* Karakuri Trick Castle, the first thing that comes to the minds of the players are its secret passageways. Out of all the dungeons I had gone through, this was the one with the most secret corridors, teeming with a variety of items and skills to find, plus bosses to fight.

Despite its innumerable hidden passageways, it's possible to clear the entire place without going through a single secret path.

That said, there are just so many of the things that even a first-time player is bound to stumble across at least one of them.

I thought it was a fun design that you didn't get to see very often, so it was one of my favorite dungeons, but there was a single thing that bugged me about it. The game gives you zero hints about where a few of the secret corridors are located. To add insult to injury, those are the passageways that lead to important items, along with the goddess statue, which teaches you new skills.

Just how much blood, sweat, and tears had I shed in the hunt for this hidden path?

It was thanks to all that hard work, though, that I could take it easy right now. I had a perfect grasp of where every last secret corridor was located.

Now the question was, where were we supposed to go next once we cleared this hidden path? Going all the way back to the entrance for a moment and reentering from there was the most surefire method, so perhaps we would get the skill located relatively close to the entrance next.

As I was planning out the route in my head, Nanami spoke to me.

"You don't seem to have much to do."

"Well, I'm not exactly busy..."

I wouldn't be able to mull everything over like this if I was.

It had to be said, though, that we were currently taking a break in a safe zone, so the truth was that we all didn't have much to do.

"How about we pretend we're newlyweds?" Nanami asked.

"...Where'd that come from?"

Sure, we had time to kill, but I had no clue where her urge to play house had come from.

"Welcome home, Master. What would you prefer to have first? Your angel?

Your maid? Or perhaps, your Na...na...mi?"

Why was she spinning around and striking a pose for each option while slowly lifting up her maid uniform? Not that it wasn't unbelievably cute, of course.

"So we're doing this whether I want to or not, huh... Heck, all those options are the same anyway. All right, then, I'll start with dinner, I guess."

"Omigoooosh \$! You're going to eat me up?!"

"...Okay, how about a bath first?"

"Omigoooosh J! A bath with Nanami?! I'll wash your back!"

"So I end up with you no matter what?!"

When I quipped back, Nanami gave me a big smile. Hmm, well, if I've got to choose, I'll definitely go with the bath, thank you very much.

"Umm, so are you always doing this sort of thing, or ...?"

Yuika seemed exasperated by our idiotic nonsense.

"It gets even worse sometimes, you know," Ludie flatly replied. As much as I'd love to deny it, she had me there.

"...The Hanamura house is really something, isn't it?"

"Hey, what's that supposed to mean...? Okay I can't really deny that the house has its fair share of strange people in it."

"Sure, there's a lot of unique types living there, but they're all good people."

Yukine had forced a smile as she replied, but I didn't think it helped much.

"Here, Master, a sandwich for you. I made sure to add *a little something* to it to ensure your lifelong love for Nanami."

"We're still going with this, are we? There's no poison or anything in here, right?"

What the hell was "lifelong" supposed to mean? That was a real worrying turn of phrase. I wasn't going to die or anything, was I?

I took a look at the sandwich she handed me. I got the feeling there were just a few more vegetables in this one compared with the one I had just finished. I

figured I'd scarf it down since she'd been kind enough to make it for me.

Nanami waited for the exact moment of my first bite before chiming in.

"Oh, incidentally, Miss Ludie actually made that sandwich."

Then it all clicked.

Nanami had been biding her time for an opportunity to give me the sandwich. Miss Ludie made this just for you, so you need to thank her was probably what she was getting at.

Still, I felt like the strange multiple-choice question at the start was unnecessary.

"Oh, um...I know it's a bit messy compared with Nanami's, but I had some spare time, so I thought I'd try making one, is all."

"No need to worry, it's really good. Thanks."

It looked perfectly normal, and it tasted great. Ludie needed to be a bit more confident in her abilities.

"Oh, really?"

She turned away, attempting to obscure the look of delight on her face.

Now that I thought about it, everyone had been making all these small gestures toward me lately. I would need to thank them for it later.

Anyways, this sure was a tasty sandwich. Wait a sec. Tasty? Sandwich? I felt like I had just eaten one recently... But when was it, though? Hmmm. And I think it smelled sort of like a cheap energy drink? Wait, was that one from Sis? *Ngh*, my head...

"Is something wrong, Takioto?"

"O-oh, no. It's nothing. Let's rest a little bit longer before we head a bit farther in and grab the skill there," I said, which once again prompted Yuika to give me a suspicious, reproachful look.

"Ohhh, so there's a skill we'll learn up ahead, is there...?"

As I replied with a wincing smile, a thought came to me—Yuika was commenting on it candidly because she was just like that, and Yukine and Ludie

had picked up on the situation themselves but were avoiding the subject on purpose.

And then another thought—I would eventually have to reveal everything not just to Nanami, but to Ludie and the others as well.

With our break over, we quickly started moving again.

"What sort of skill are you after?"

I hesitated slightly on whether I should answer Yuika's question in detail or not, but oh well, it was probably fine.

"The Tonsou skill."

"What's that supposed to be?"

Ninja skills were meant to be secret, so Ludie and the others probably weren't aware of them. Even in the game, the player won't learn how to obtain any of them if they don't buddy up to one of the two ninja characters. It's a different story once either of them joins your party, though—they start blabbing about the skills every chance they get. Are you sure you should be doing that, ninja...?

"It's basically a skill that helps you run away from enemies."

Tonsou is a super-efficient ability that you always want to pick up when speedrunning. Fleeing encounters is vital for improving your times.

A common tactic in speedrunning role-playing games is attempting to reach the farthest town you can at low levels. That means you'll be fleeing from every single encounter on your way to somewhere you would normally get to in the latter half of the game.

But what's the point of that?

There are a number of reasons why. To get weapons that are powerful for the early parts of the game; to befriend characters in that town and add them to your party; to gain magic, skills, and valuable items that would otherwise be a long ways off; to grab items from the houses there to power yourself up...

This is all in the interest of rapidly training your low-level characters.

Then after buying equipment from a town located in a high-level area to supercharge your offense, you level by fighting enemies you could now one-shot. This is the best possible method, efficiency-wise.

Of course, it's possible to do something similar in *Magical* *Explorer, as well—run away from all the fights in the Beginner's Dungeon and similar areas, defeat the boss with fire sigil stones, and use a similar method to clear dungeons that would be unlocked afterward. Then you could farm experience in the most efficient areas possible once you get the proper weapons and equipment together.

In truth, I had planned on doing that at first myself, and I'd already tried adopting a portion of the overall strategy.

But the thing was, this world wasn't a game.

Even if I gathered magic particles to raise my base stats, I could still lose against people like Yukine or Claris, who had a keen sense for combat.

To improve my combat abilities, I would need to spar with and confront a variety of monsters, and powerful ones at that.

Still, using a strong weapon to annihilate monsters for experience wasn't a total waste of effort.

Efficiently farming experience while also squaring off against seasoned combatants to hone your own abilities—that was the best way to go about it.

Next up, I would need to think about efficient methods of farming. Dungeons generally provided good opportunities for amassing magic particles. To accomplish this without wasting too much time, I would need to guarantee that I could flee from weaker monsters.

This is the biggest advantage of Tonsou from a speedrunning perspective, but the skill has one other effect: It raises your speed. In-game, increased speed means you act earlier in battle.

But what would high agility do in real life?

The way I was thinking, making my movement faster would be an incredible way of powering up.

With all that in mind, there was no doubt that Tonsou was an extremely useful skill to have.

We continued on our path, defeating monsters as we went, eventually coming upon what looked like a large hall. There were a number of wooden pedestals and scrolls lying around, but I honestly didn't need to look at any of them.

To obtain the Tonsou skill, you needed to do two things. First, you had to find a hidden door without any hints. Second, you had to solve a puzzle.

On the floor right before the end goal, there was a scroll with a hint that you would then use to solve said puzzle...but thanks to my knowledge of the game, I already had the answer memorized.

Having now obtained the Tonsou skill, which improved our ability to escape, we obviously reentered Karakuri Trick Castle and used this newfound art to flee from enemies at every opportunity...except things didn't quite go like that.

Even on our second run through Karakuri Trick Castle, we didn't ignore any of the fights with the weaker monsters, defeating them without exception as we continued on. We made sure to collect the loot they dropped, too, of course.

"There really are quite a lot of traps, aren't there?" Ludie grumbled as she jumped over the trap Nanami had identified.

"That's just the sorta dungeon it is."

If there's one thing in this dungeon I'm disappointed about, it's that the traps don't unlock character CG scenes. But even if that were the case, I would have planned on avoiding every last one with not just heartrending but full-bodied sorrow. Still, a teensy, tiny bit can't hurt, right...?

"This really is one incredible party we've got...," Yuika said keenly.

Immediately sending my fantasies to the winds and feigning composure, I asked her what she was getting at.

"What about it?"

"Even back at Susano Martial Arts Academy, you rarely ever saw teams that were this incredible."

"Seriously?"

"Oh yeah, it would totally put the upperclassmen there to shame."

"Argh, looks like I'm the biggest burden here."

"You think so? Didn't seem that way at all to me. You can heal, too."

The fight had simply ended before Yuika could lend a hand, but she had been really active in defeating low-level monsters throughout the dungeon. Plus, it was a treat for the eyes just having her around. Made me want my own little sister, too.

The dungeon that was going to serve as the stage for our competition with Gabby, Twilight Path, didn't actually have to be cleared at all.

In *MX*, the player doesn't reach it until about midgame. It's one of the dungeons that unlocks when you enter the Three Committees, and it's also used for a Ceremonial Committee event.

On top of that, the Twilight Path doesn't really pose much of a challenge. Outside of the creatures lurking in its deepest sections, the enemies aren't particularly strong, either. Though, perhaps the dungeon only seems easy, since your party is pretty well equipped by the time you join the Three Committees.

If there's one thing you needed to look out for in this dungeon, it was the traps. Still, most of them could be identified with a low-level Find Traps skill, and they wouldn't prove any trouble at all thanks to the ring I'd picked up.

Furthermore, the items you could get here were proportionate to the dungeon's level, and while they were indeed valuable, they didn't appeal to me all that much. I had already gotten them in a different dungeon, and the rarity and abilities of the rings Ludie and the others were already wearing outdid the Twilight Path items anyway.

However, the dungeons added into the game as bonus content often contain good items that are disproportional to its difficulty. Those rings from before were no exception. That was the whole reason I had prioritized clearing the bonus-content dungeons in the first place.

Also, the monsters that showed up here could all be found in other dungeons, and none of them were worth mentioning. Similarly, the item drops in this place could be summed up with a resounding "meh."

In short, I didn't care about the Twilight Path, and it wasn't really worth visiting. From a pure-efficiency perspective, I would have liked to go back to Karakuri Trick Castle, which Yukine and the others were still running even now.

Despite my list of complaints, you couldn't afford to miss this dungeon if you

"In regard to little Yuika, the truth is, the principal seems to have already had her eyes on her. That must have spurred the Student Council's interest, wouldn't you say?"

"I get it, so it's all because of Marino, then."

"Oh, please, it isn't only the Student Council that's shown interest, you know. The same goes for the Morals Committee. In fact, the minister and I thought it prudent to reach out to her ourselves, too. That is why I wanted to hear your opinion on the matter, you see."

"Hmm?" I couldn't help cocking my head. "Hold on a minute. The Ceremonial Committee already made a promise with Gabb—er, with Gabriella, right?"

At this, Shion put up both her hands to try to calm me down.

"Don't give me that scary look. This is all in the case that Gabriella loses here."

"Well, you're already aware of Yuika's abilities, so it seems fine to me."

However...

"Gabriella can put up plenty of fight herself, though. She is clearly better than me academically, at the very least. Those grades aren't something she could've earned overnight, either."

I couldn't deny that her talents in combat were a step behind the main heroines. But Gabby had the personality to put in the effort to train if she wanted. I'd obviously think she was trying to ingratiate herself with the Hanamuras, or that she was Kousuke Takioto's personal favorite, or... Now it clicked. I understood what Shion was getting at, sure, but I couldn't help but wince a little.

"That's what I mean."

"I get it. She's got skills, and the students think she has someone backing her

"Is Minister Benito not in favor of Gabriella joining the Ceremonial Committee?"

"Hmph, yes, a difficult question... I don't have a clue."

I felt my body crumple from the shattered tension.

"Y-you don't know?"

"As if I have any idea what that man is thinking. He does appear to want her to grow, that much I will say."

That was somewhat of an explanation. There was a lot I could say here, but concisely put, Benito was definitely just as much of a doting brother in this world as he is in-game.

"But he doesn't want her to chase after him."

"Oh really..."

"Personally, I find the minister respectable. A worthy person to model oneself after."

"Perhaps something else is going on within the Evangelista family... Though, actually, is it all right for me to even say that?"

"Come now, you haven't been sworn to silence. Go ahead, you can simply say I decided it was fine to talk about, no?"

Her reasoning was a little bit twisted, wasn't it? How very Shion.

"But if I do that, it'll lead toward the bad ending, won't it?"

"Hmm, what is this 'bad ending' of which you speak?"

"Don't worry about it. It's just that I don't think Gabriella's going to join the Ceremonial Committee."

"...Because you're going to beat her?"

"Well, that's obvious, but no. It's because she has a good head on her shoulders and can stand on her own."

She had her airheaded moments, but she was a diligent girl who really thought things through.

After several more minutes, Minister Benito made his entrance.

"Looks like he's here. I suppose it is time for me to attend to my post," Shion said.

"...Things are already heating up, aren't they √?"

The source of this conundrum—Benito—looked over toward us with a smile, unfazed by it all.

As for why the fifth layer in particular, it was so we would come together on the layer with a floor boss.

The Twilight Path had several different routes to its deepest layers.

The simplest way of putting it was that there were four spatial magic circles to get to the next layer. Not only did each of these four circles teleport you to different a location, but since they also led to their own, independent layer, the odds that we would encounter one another were slim. Though depending on which circle we chose, there was a chance that we could end up on the same floor together.

The floors with boss battles were the one exception to this system; they only had a single version, so we would be able to meet up there.

I assumed that Shion would be waiting for us in the safe zone right before the boss.

"The rules are crystal clear. Yuika, Gabriella, and I will each take different spatial magic circles and make our way through the dungeon. The first person to reach Shion on the fifth layer is the victor. Right?"

We followed Benito and teleported to the Twilight Path dungeon.

I touched the wall and confirmed I was feeling what I was feeling, then waited for Yuika and Gabriella. Nanami appeared to have something she wanted to check for herself, so she went up to Minister Benito and started talking with him as she examined the various magic circles.

Once I made sure Yuika and Gabby had been teleported here, I walked behind them as I looked over at Nanami.

Here was where she and I planned on making a bit of a scene.

The Twilight Path also contained a few hidden floors. I planned on opening the one that would be the most mentally taxing.

As to how I would do that...I had actually consulted Nanami on the matter already.

First, she would pretend to accidentally press a switch, and while I pretended to regain my balance, I would insert a key. Yup, the plan was foolproof. We had actually rehearsed it in secret beforehand and confirmed it would be safe. Well, some monsters would show up, so it wasn't *completely* safe, but...

"Okay, so we choose one of these magic circles and head on in..."

All right, it was right about time. Nanami would hit the switch...

"Hmph, none of the paths will prove difficult for me anyway, so I'll choose the farthest right circle for *my* route!"

Gabby grinned as she spoke. Just then, she stumbled on an indent in the floor and reached her hand out to the wall to keep her balance.

Ker-chak.

Uhhh?

"Oh my!"

"Tch, if only you had fallen flat on your face..."

"How dare you sa...?"

Incensed, Gabby had started to berate Yuika, but she couldn't finish her sentence.

The ground shook with a loud rumble, as if something heavy was being dragged across the floor. I assumed that everyone besides Nanami and myself was totally confused right now, wondering what exactly had happened.

The instant after the ground stopped rumbling, a magic circle—like pattern appeared at Gabby's and Yuika's feet, and several different characters emerged on its surface.

I didn't really understand what had happened, but all's well that ends well. Now I just needed to walk up, ask everyone if they were okay, and slip the key in!

Gabby lost her balance from another tremor, landing so perfectly on the characters on the magic circle, it was like she had been aiming for it. Then Yuika came up next to her, stepping on a few characters beneath her feet.

She was definitely still annoyed, though, and I wished she would stop pinching me every time I said something to lift Gabby's spirits.

However, I was surprised that Yuika didn't look dejected or panicked like Gabby did. Of course, keeping cool was better than the alternative, but how

was she able to pull that off? I knew what was coming up ahead already, but I hadn't filled her in on anything, so it would have made plenty of sense for her to be anxious and uncertain.

"Take a good look at Yuika here; she was the one who stepped on the final key of the passcode, and she's not fazed at all."

"Excuuuse me? What are you talking about, Takioto?"

"R-right, yeah! Anyway, let's hurry up and get outta here. Nanami and the others have to be worried, too."

"Yes, yes, of coooourse. Let's run along, then."

Yuika walked off in an angry huff, and we followed along to continue onward.

Monsters would start showing up from here on out, so we needed to be careful.

"Something about this is off, don't you think?"

"What do you mean?"

"I'm talking about the three of us teaming up to fight together," Yuika said before she got in close to the sand-throwing hag and punched her light magic—enhanced gauntlet into the monster's gut. As the sand-throwing hag's body lifted off the ground, Yuika sent out a flurry of superhuman jabs straight out of a fighting game at the creature.

But the other monsters weren't content watching the sand-throwing hag get pummeled. The imp that appeared at the same time set its sights on Yuika and cast low-level dark magic.

"Takioto."

Naturally, I was already moving before she opened her mouth. I stretched out my stole, deflecting the dark magic, and took a step forward to close in on the adorably resentful imp before I stopped; a spear of light had come flying from behind me.

"Feels off, you say? Why, that should be my line."

Light Spear, a mid-level light spell, would shoot out a different number of javelins depending on the caster's abilities. "Oh yeah, sure is amazing, all right."

"Is this a boss floor, then? This was much shorter than I expected."

"Quite. Even the Beginner's Dungeon is longer."

Both Gabby and Yuika were surprised to have reached the boss room not even an hour after our exploration of the Twilight Path had gotten underway.



"That's one of the things you see a lotta times with displacement traps."

There were several types of displacement traps.

The most common type were ones that would transport you to a different section of the same layer to try to screw with your sense of direction. Since you were simply being sent somewhere on the same floor, you could use escape items to get out of the situation.

The second most common were these kinds of traps, where they send you to a special event floor, event layer, or monster house. For event layers and monster houses, clearing said floor would send you back to your original location or let you continue down to an even deeper layer in the dungeon.

In cases where you returned to the previous layer, the place you'd end up would often be rather tight and constrained. By contrast, in the event that you advanced deeper into the dungeon, you would find yourself in a vast and sprawling area or a zone with a high encounter rate.

I assumed this was all the product of game-balance considerations.

This event layer was the type that would send you back to the original layer at the end, so it was of an appropriately constrained size.

"I wonder what's waiting for us up ahead."

"Whatever it is, I bet the three of us'll be just fine... Better keep our wits about us," I said before enchanting my stole with light. Then I pushed open the door with my Third Hand. Despite how huge it was, I hadn't needed to put much force behind it. If anything, it felt a bit like the door had opened automatically.

On the other side of the door was a wide-open space. It was about the size of an elementary school playground.

Activating my mana and slipping through the door, I heard a roar echo from above after advancing a few steps inside.

"Gwoooooooooooooogr!"

"Th-the truth is, those clothes? Well, um, when you get water on them, they become totally see-through! Whoopsies!"

"...Whaaaaaaaaaaaaaaa?!"

"G-get them wet, and they're one hundred percent see-through!"

Idiots, all of them, everyone who made this stupid game! It went without saying, but I reloaded my save file over and over again just to dive straight into

The scene that shows them taking off their second layer of clothes, their faces red with humiliation after hitting a wall, is truly fantastic.

Indeed. The game allowed me to enjoy seeing all manner of reactions from the heroines, from those who huddled into a ball after being forced into the outfit, to others who quivered in shame, and still others who would readily grab a wand and strike a pose in the getup.



That was why I had thought I needed to laud the devs.

But now I wanted to "laud" them straight to hell!

How many more times were they going to back me into a corner like this before they were satisfied? I mean, just think about it a second—having to equip sexy equipment in order to proceed? Turning clothes totally see-through when they get wet? Try experiencing that in real life for yourself! Whoa, whoa, whoa now, hold up here.

"Hey, why're you coming over here with those grubby mitts? W-wait, please. I need some mental prep time, pleas— Hey, why're you also touching me, Gabby? I can get myself changed just fine, so stop— Hey— Noooooo!"

Let me ask you, have you ever overcome something before?

Ever toil and suffer to break through?

I...exchanged something very important of mine to do just that.
