

MODEL 51 L

The J. C. Higgins Model 51 L is a 5-shot deluxe grade high-power big-game rifle that costs much less than any other rifle of comparable quality. Your choice of America's favorite big-game cartridges — .270 — .30-06 — .243 and .308 are available in the Model 51 L.

Its genuine HVA sporting action is world-renowned for strength, simplicity and ease of operation. Trigger is smooth and creep-free. Barrel is fine proof-tested molybdenum steel built

to take a lifetime of normal use.

Stock is beautifully grained checkered American walnut with Monte Carlo styling, full pistol grips and semi-beavertail forearm. Receiver is drilled and tapped to take standard J. C. Higgins telescope mounts and bases, as well as any of the well-known receiver sights. Sling is made of genuine full grain leather.

CLEANING & LUBRICATING

IMPORTANT: Before firing this gun, be sure to thoroughly clean inside of barrel of all grease and any obstructions.

After making sure the rifle is empty, to remove the bolt put the safety in the "off" position and raise the bolt handle. Place the thumb of the left hand on bolt release lever, press the lever away from receiver and at the same time pull the bolt rearward from receiver.

Push a brass cleaning brush soaked in nitro solvent through the barrel from the rear chamber end and work it through the entire length of the bore several times. Follow this by pushing clean patches through the bore until the last patch comes out unsoiled. A light protective film of oil may be applied to the clean bore. Periodically, dirt and fouling should be removed from the bolt and other operating parts. This should be done with a tooth brush soaked in nitro solvent, followed by a thorough wiping and light oiling.

To replace bolt align bolt with internal mating surfaces on receiver. Push bolt forward against tension of release lever on side of receiver. If the bolt does not slide into the rifle, check alignment of extractor. Extractor should be aligned with lugs at front and rear of bolt.

Your Model 51 L is treated with new siliconized and polarized oil. This exclusive patented process oil or lubricant gets down into the pores of the steel and protects against perspiration and other corrosive elements which cause rust. This oil makes J. C. Higgins guns the most rust resistant of any guns you can buy. It gives the best lubrication of any oil tested. And it protects and beautifies stock and forearm.

A J. C. Higgins Rifle Cleaning Kit is available in either .270 — .30-06 — .243 and .308 calibers (at any Sear's Store or from the catalogue). It includes all the necessary materials to carry out the above operations. Another valuable piece of equipment is a J. C. Higgins Silicone Cloth. This will help protect the outside surfaces of the rifle from rust and moisture if used

periodically.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

TO MAKE GUN SAFE: Safety is located at rear top on the right hand side of receiver. The action is locked when the safety is in the rearward position.

TO RELEASE SAFETY: Push safety in forward position and the gun is ready to fire.

TO LOAD CHAMBER AND MAGAZINE: Raise the bolt handle out of the locking notch and draw bolt assembly straight back as far as it will go. Place a cartridge in the magazine, locating it as far back over the magazine as possible. Then push it down into the magazine until it is caught and held by edge of receiver. Repeat this procedure until the magazine is full, (five cartridges), or the desired number of cartridges have been inserted, then close the bolt.

TO OPERATE: When gun is fired, raise the bolt handle and pull back sharply to the rear as far as it will go; this will extract and eject the spent shell. Push the bolt forward and the bolt handle down into locking notch to load the chamber with a cartridge from the magazine.

Always use the safety to prevent accidental firing.

TO REMOVE LOADED SHELL FROM CHAMBER WITHOUT FIRING: With safety in off (forward) position, raise the bolt handle and pull the bolt back sharply. This will extract and eject the unfired cartridge. Hold the left hand over the loading port to catch the unfired

cartridges.

TO REMOVE LOADED SHELL FROM MAGAZINE: Push down on cartridges in magazine with the fingers and push bolt forward over cartridges making certain no cartridge has been fed into chamber. Lock by turning down the bolt handle into locking notch. Turn gun so that trigger guard is up. Press floor plate release lever until floor plate unhooks and stops against the hand. Turn the gun over, release the hand slowly and the magazine will unload.

TO REPLACE FLOOR PLATE: Insert magazine follower into opening, swing hinged floor plate

upward until it is locked in position.

TO REMOVE STOCK FROM ACTION: Remove bolt assembly. Turn gun with trigger guard in vertical position. Release floor plate and magazine follower. Remove two trigger guard screws and stock bushing which hold the trigger guard to action. Lift stock away from action.

TO REPLACE THE ACTION IN THE STOCK: With the floor plate released (floor plate follower and spring) insert the trigger guard in the stock. Replace the action and barrel in the stock. Reassemble two trigger guard screws and stock bushing. After making sure these screws are tight, replace floor plate guide follower into opening and swing upward until floor plate becomes locked.
