Page 3, 4.4, Consideration of existing labels

Replace the first sentence in the first paragraph with the following:

Affixing new labels over old labels is permitted if the information content of the new label is for the same gas and grade (e.g., industrial, medical, food). For gas mixtures having the same gas components and the same hazard classification, this is also permitted; in addition, the concentrations of the components are required to be the same for medical gas mixtures.
