It was a pleasure to meet you at the DLD in Munich, where we shortly talked about monetary theory.

As promised, I am sending you a PDF of my book Clash of Currencies, which in 2009 was published under the German title *WELT MACHT GELD*.

Originally, my background lies in engineering, where I am working in the development of extremely lightweight diesel engines for aircraft (zoche.de). Some 15 years ago, I got curious about monetary theory; my research into that topic earned me some invitations as speaker e.g. at UNESCO conferences and allowed me to establish connections to

scholars as well as activists in the field =most of which are working on complementary currency systems or payment =olutions). Next month, I will be presenting at a monetary conference in =urich (program attached).

... some more info about myself:

I was born in Munich in =968, where I studied engineering and philosophy.

I am holding numerous international patents on internal combustion =ngines, electro motors and reverse vending sytems. In 1992, my work on =ighweight diesel engines for aircraft received a research award. Since =995, the Zoche aero-diesel is on permanent display in the Deutsche =useum.

In 2001, I cofounded the grassroots movement The United Transnational =epublics which is striving for a more participatory globalisation =nd has been joined by more than 6.000 citizens from over 100 nation =tates.

In 2006, I was invited by the UNESCO to present at the =i>International Forum on the Social Science and to contribute to =he Buenos Aires Declaration. In 2007, I was a speaker at the =i>UNESCO Monterrey Forum, where I co-authored the Monterrey =anifesto and was selected as winner in the Global Governance =ssays Contest.

In 2008, I was delivering the opening keynote at the Impulso XXI =nternational Mechanical Engineering Congress in Monterrey.

Clash of Currencies is my second book publication following my =erman title WELT MACHT GELD.

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
