I appreciate your candor as well as Jeffrey's legitimate concerns...I do.

But I have reviewed each of the links below and the only one that even appears related is the offer for 8 million dollars from 2009.

I think we all know the state of the union in 2009, and when there were no bites, it appears to have been removed from the market for a more optimistic future.
