I am holding off following up with the *Daily Telegraph* in the interim.

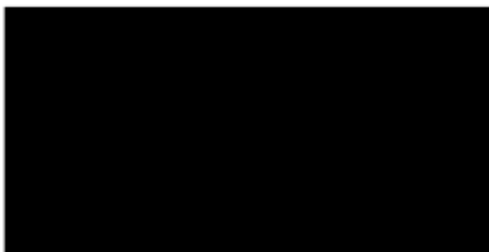
