Symbolically, the womb. MAIM starts with a rather small YOD in the top left lesser square, The throne of the Son, from its lower tip a short line runs out to the left top of the lower lesser square, then down to the lower left corner of that square, just touching. The other section starts also from the lower tip of the YQD, runs up to the middle of the top right square, then sweeps round, touching the outside of the Great Square at its mid-point, then in a little to

MAIM as a final, by contrast appears much more square, touching as it does all four sides of the Great Square and completly enclosing the cross dividing it. It is then the closed womb. A YOD runs right along the top of the Great Square, its lower tip linking down to the bottom bar, all the way to the left of the base, then up the left side, tipping inward just as it reaches the left end of the YOD. It is the womb closing and protecting the fetus, the little cross.

It is one of the Three Mother Letters, ALEPH, MAIM, and SHIN, and the easiest to see why it is called a "Mother" Letter. In this case, when we say it is the womb, it is in symbolism of the cosmic womb. The MAIM (Hebrew MIM) in its Final form is symbolically the Firmament as between the Waters above dividing them from the Waters below. The "womb of time" is a human concept, temporal, not the Infinite. The vast majority of Man is still "in the womb" at a spiritual level. Embrionic, drawing on the Mother for his spiritual substance. Again, the spelling MIM, having the phalic YOD in it, bears much reflection. In the Old Testament we find MRIM (Miriam) which, with the symbolic birth of Christ loses the closed womb, the final M and thus becomes "MRI" (Mary) The Womb is open, having given birth. "MRI" is literally "bitterness", from the sea being salt or "bitter", and the Great Mother is achetypally in travail, a state ending in the Birth of the SON; "-- remembereth no more her agony for joy that (a) Man is born into the world."

The numerical value of MAIM is 40. It is also As a final form it is .600
