## My Devil – A short essay on my image of Satan by F.V.Fargas

For me the Devil is an embodiment of everything that I love. But look how many will come shouting, acusing me of sacrifice, exhumation and all that. Please, beginning with this essay, leave all your thoughts at the door and listen.

First of all, I use the name Devil and not Satan because SATAN or Satanism has become something that has no connection to the god that I know. Either if we talk about the so-called 'LaVeyan/Modern Satanism' or 'Theistic/Spiritual Satanism', this change that was produced isn't comparing with my beliefs anymore. What is important for me is the truth that I practice and believe in. I'm not talking only about magick, ritual, philosophy. I'm talking strictly about my HUMAN NATURE. I try to be as natural as I can, not socially accepted. Unlike those who try to change their attitude and beliefs, I prefer to stay original. Some will say this is ignorance and laziness, but it's really not so. You see now, I'm very skeptic. I believe in what I know. I like proof, not opinion.

Though I'm an exception when talking about this subject, being neither a Satanist nor a Christian, I'm somewhere in between these two. Of course, my writing here will present only my Satanic part of my own existence.

To explain this 'Satanic' or 'Dark' part of my existence, I'll have to explain first what I understand of being Satanic or Dark. One thing somehow interesting is that, even though I'm more of a traditionalist I like to add in my occult practice new elements that don't necessarily stand of Satanism. But it is rare for me to follow something that I've heard or read in a book. Per example, there are many who affirm that Satan is the god X from Y mythology, and that Satanism is actually Paganism. Many try to tell me that Satanists are in fact, pagans.



I DON'T deny the fact that Satanism has its roots in Paganism and I DON'T deny that Satan was worshiped under different names in different cultures and I DON'T deny the fact that SATAN/The Devil came with the birth of Christianity. The SATAN idea, force or entity (as you wish) existed long before any mythology and civilization. What I'm trying to say is that SATANism is another form of Paganism

given as a retort to Christianity, that uses the name Satan to emphasize the fact that in this world there are opposing forces to the Christian god. What I'm trying to say is that we can't be sure that Satan is the god X from Y pantheon. There is no document or clear proof older than Christianity that says that Satan is the god X or that talks about a divinity called SATAN. Who can prove that Satan is the god X from Y pantheon but with a different name?

Pagans worshipped the god X, Satanists worshipped SATAN. Set is Set, Enki is Enki, Ptah is Ptah, Malek Ta'us is Malek Ta'us.. and Satan is Satan. Even if these resemble or have the same 'jobs', it doesn't make them one and the same. If Malek Ta'us is Satan than Satanists are Yezidi? no.

Christian Priests are against spiritual meditation and magick (even though, they do it unconsciously at every ceremony). With the help of magick you can heal and destroy. Every man has the right to use magick. With the help of magick and spiritual meditation you open a new world. A world in which you don't have to kneel before a false god to ask for food. A world in which you fight to obtain what you desire.
