The *Elder Sign* is sometimes confused with the *Pnakotic Pentagram* and the swastika-like *Sign of the Old Ones*. However, the actual *Elder Sign* is a symbol which is often compared to a tree or tree-branch, and consists on a central line with three lines branching off to the left and two lines branching off to the right:



This symbol seems to be all but completely unknown to western occultists. However, it is easily recognizable as a relatively common symbol in Arabic magical traditions. It appears to be one of the 28 graphemes attributed to the first century Turkish physician Disagoridos (ديســـقوريدوس).¹ The symbol became more popular in Arab occult traditions in the mid-9th century because of its inclusion in the text _Shuq al Mastaham Fi Ma'arifat Rumuz al Aqlaam_ (البـن وحشــية) by Ibn Wahshiyya (البـن وحشــية). Wahshiyya is famous for his contributions to the Arabic grimoire known in the West as _Picatrix_² which he made via his text _Kitab al Falaha al Nabatiyya_ (کتــاب الفلاحــة النبطيـــة). He is likewise famous for his decipherment of many Egyptian hieroglyphs centuries before a similar breakthrough occurred in the west.³

Below is a summary of the esoteric associations of the *Elder Sign* based on the writings of *Wahshiyya*,⁴ and supplemented with additional material, primarily from *Ibn 'Arabi* (ابات عربي).⁵ Hopefully, this might provide some insight into the significance and use of this symbol within Arab magical traditions, and perhaps by extension, the magick of the Cthulhu mythos:

The name of the sign is "Zai" (زاي)

It is a Solar Grapheme [huruf ash-shams (حروف الشمس)]

Its numeric value is 7 (Y)

It is associated with the 19th lunar mansion [*manzil* (مـنزل)] which is called "The Sting" [*ash-shaula* (الشــولاء)]

Its zodiacal sign is Scorpio [burj al 'agrab (بسرج العقسرب)]

The divine name associated with this sign is "The Living One" [al Hayy (الحى)]

Terrestrially it is associated with the element Water and celestially it is associated with the element of Air.
